#### **Before You Begin**

- 1 Save and close all open files and exit all open applications.
- 2 Shut down your computer.
  - Windows 8.1: On the **Start** screen, click or tap the power icon  $\mathbf{0} \rightarrow$ Shut down
  - Windows 7: Click or tap Start → Shut down.



NOTE: If you are using a different operating system, see the documentation of your operating system for shut-down instructions.

- 3 Disconnect your computer and all attached devices from their electrical outlets.
- 4 Disconnect all cables such as telephone cables, network cables and so on, from your computer.
- 5 Disconnect all attached devices and peripherals, such as keyboard, mouse, monitor, and so on, from your computer.
- 6 Remove any media card and optical disc from your computer, if applicable.

#### Safety Instructions

CAUTION: Before touching anything inside your computer, ground yourself by touching an unpainted metal surface, such as the metal at the back of the computer. While you work, periodically touch an unpainted metal surface to dissipate static electricity, which could harm internal components.



CAUTION: When you disconnect a cable, pull on its connector or on its pull-tab, not on the cable itself. Some cables have connectors with locking tabs or thumb-screws that you must disengage before disconnecting the cable. When disconnecting cables, keep them evenly aligned to avoid bending any connector pins. When connecting cables, make sure that the ports and connectors are correctly oriented and aligned.



CAUTION: To disconnect a network cable, first unplug the cable from your computer and then unplug the cable from the network device.


### **Removing the Battery**

#### **Procedure**

- 1 Close the display and turn the computer over.
- 2 Slide the battery-release latches to the unlock position.
- **3** Using your fingertips, lift the battery at an angle and remove the battery off the computer base.


Insert the battery at an angle into the battery bay and align the tabs on the battery with the slots on the battery bay.



- **3** Replace the screw that secures the optical-drive bracket to the optical-drive assembly.
- 4 Slide the optical-drive assembly into the optical-drive bay and align the screw hole on the optical-drive assembly with the screw hole on the computer base.
- 5 Replace the screw that secures the optical-drive assembly to the computer base.

# Removing the Memory Module(s)





# Removing the Hard Drive







# Replacing the Keyboard

**NOTE:** If you are installing a new keyboard, fold the cables the same way they are folded on the old keyboard. For more information, see "Folding the Keyboard Cables".

- Slide the keyboard cable and the keyboard-backlight cable into the connectors on the system board and press down on the latches to secure the cables.
- 2 Turn the keyboard over.
- 3 Slide the tabs on the keyboard into the slots on the palm rest and snap the keyboard into place.

#### Folding the Keyboard Cables




CAUTION: Do not apply excess pressure while folding the cables.

The cables on the keyboard are not folded when you receive a replacement keyboard. Follow these instructions to fold the cables on the replacement keyboard the same way they are folded on the old keyboard.



**NOTE:** Keyboard-backlight cable is present only on a backlit-keyboard.







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

# Replacing the Wireless Card

CAUTION: To avoid damage to the wireless card, do not place any cables under it.

- **3** Replace the screw that secures the wireless card to the system board.
- 4 Connect the antenna cables to the wireless card.

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



# Removing the Coin-Cell Battery

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
CAUTION: Removing the coin-cell battery resets the BIOS settings to default. It is recommended that you note the BIOS settings before removing the coin-cell battery.

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

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

# Removing the System Board



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**NOTE:** Your computer's Service Tag is stored in the system board. You must enter the Service Tag in the BIOS setup program after you replace the system board.



**NOTE:** Replacing the system board removes any changes you have made to the BIOS using the BIOS setup program. You must make the desired changes again after you replace the system board.



**NOTE:** Before disconnecting the cables from the system board, note the location of the connectors so that you can reconnect them correctly after you replace the system board.





# Replacing the Heat Sink



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CAUTION: Incorrect alignment of the heat sink can cause damage to the system board and processor.



**NOTE:** The original thermal grease can be reused if the original system board and heat sink are reinstalled together. If either the system board or the heat sink is replaced, use the thermal pad provided in the kit to make sure that thermal conductivity is achieved.







# Flashing the BIOS

You may need to flash (update) the BIOS when an update is available or when you replace the system board. To flash the BIOS:

- 1 Turn on the computer.
- 2 Go to dell.com/support.
- 3 If you have your computer's Service Tag, type your computer's Service Tag and click **Submit**.

If you do not have your computer's Service Tag, click **Detect My Product** to allow automatic detection of the Service Tag.
