 - Windows 8: Move your mouse pointer to the upper-right or lowerright corner of the screen to open the charms sidebar, and then click or tap **Settings** \rightarrow **Power** \rightarrow **Shut down**.
 - Windows 7: Click or tap Start → Shut down.



NOTE: If you are using a different operating system, see the documentation of your operating system for shut-down instructions.

- 3 Disconnect your computer and all attached devices from their electrical outlets.
- 4 Disconnect all cables such as telephone cables, network cables and so on, from your computer.
- 5 Disconnect all attached devices and peripherals, such as keyboard, mouse, monitor, and so on, from your computer.
- Remove any media card and optical disc from your computer, if applicable.

CAUTION: Only a certified service technician is authorized to remove the computer cover and access any of the components inside the computer. See the safety instructions for complete information about safety precautions, working inside your computer, and protecting against electrostatic discharge.



CAUTION: Before touching anything inside your computer, ground yourself by touching an unpainted metal surface, such as the metal at the back of the computer. While you work, periodically touch an unpainted metal surface to dissipate static electricity, which could harm internal components.



CAUTION: When you disconnect a cable, pull on its connector or on its pull-tab, not on the cable itself. - **5** Turn on your computer.


Removing the Battery



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Procedure

- 1 Close the display and turn the computer over.
- 2 Slide the battery-release latches to the unlock position.

- 3 Using your fingertips, lift the battery at an angle and remove the battery off the battery bay.
- **4** Turn the computer over and open the display as far as possible.
- 5 Press and hold the power button for 5 seconds after the computer is unplugged to ground the system board.

Replacing the Battery



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Procedure

- 1 Slide the tabs on the battery into the slots on the battery bay and snap the battery into place.
 - **NOTE:** Make sure the battery-release latches are secured.
- 2 Turn the computer over and open the display as far as possible.





- **3** Replace the screw that secures the optical-drive bracket to the optical-drive assembly.
- 4 Slide the optical-drive assembly into the optical-drive bay and align the screw hole on the optical-drive bracket with the screw hole on computer base.
- 5 Replace the screw that secures the optical-drive assembly to the computer base.

Removing the Hard Drive

CAUTION: To avoid data loss, do not remove the hard drive while the computer is in Sleep or On state.





- **3** Replace the screws that secure the hard-drive bracket to the hard drive.
- 4 Place the hard-drive assembly on the computer base.
- 5 Slide the hard-drive assembly to secure the hard-drive connector with the system-board connector.
- **6** Replace the screw that secures the hard-drive assembly to the computer base.

Removing the Memory Module




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Prerequisites

- 1 Remove the <u>battery</u>.

- 1 Using your fingertips, pry apart the securing clips on each end of the memory-module slot until the memory module pops up.



Removing the Wireless Card

Replacing the Wireless Card



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Procedure

- Align the notch on the wireless card with the tab on the wireless-card slot.

- **3** Press the other end of the wireless card down and replace the screw that secures the wireless card to the computer base.
- 4 Connect the antenna cables to the wireless card.
 The following table provides the antenna cable color schemes for the wireless card supported by your computer.

Removing the Keyboard



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
Prerequisites

Procedure

- 1 Turn the computer over and open the display as far as possible.
- 2 Using a plastic scribe, release the tabs that secure the keyboard to the palm rest.

3 Carefully turn the keyboard over and place it on the palm rest.



Replacing the Keyboard



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Procedure

NOTE: If you are installing a new keyboard, fold the cables the same way they are folded on the old keyboard. For more information, see "Folding the Keyboard Cables".

- 2 Carefully turn the keyboard over, slide the tabs on the keyboard into the slots on the palm rest, and snap the keyboard into place.
- 3 Close the display and turn the computer over.

Folding the Keyboard Cables




CAUTION: Do not apply excess pressure while folding the cables.

The cables on the keyboard are not folded when you receive a replacement keyboard. Follow these instructions to fold the cables on the replacement keyboard the same way they are folded on the old keyboard.



NOTE: Keyboard-backlight cable is present only on a backlit-keyboard.











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



Removing the Heat-Sink Assembly



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




