

Power Management Modes

If you have VESA's DPM compliance display card or software installed in your PC, the monitor automatically reduces its power consumption when not in use. This referred to as *Power Save Mode*. If the computer detects input from keyboard, mouse, or other input devices, the monitor automatically resumes functioning. 

LCD Monitor Quality & Pixel Policy

During the LCD Monitor manufacturing process, it is not uncommon for one or more pixels to become fixed in an unchanging state. The visible result is a fixed pix appears as an extremely tiny dark or bright discolored spot. When the pixel remains permanently lit, it is known as a "bright dot." When the pixel remains black, known as a "dark dot."

This software provides Power Saving mode with your Monitor. The Power Saving mode allows user to select either "Screen dim" or " Sleep" when your PC goes to the screen saver mode.

- 1. Screen dim monitor dims to minimum brightness level when the PC is in the screen saver mode.
- 2. Sleep monitor goes into the sleep mode when the PC is in the screen saver mode.



The PowerNap software provides an option to check if there is a new update. Please check periodically if there is a new update for your software.

Attaching the Stand

NOTE: The stand base is detached when the monitor is shipped from the factory.

1. Assemble the stand riser to stand base.



- a. Place the monitor stand base on a stable table top.
- b. Slide the monitor stand body in the correct direction down onto the stand base until it clicks into place.
- 2. Attach the stand assembly to the monitor:



- a. Place the monitor on a soft cloth or cushion near the edge of desk.
- b. Align the stand assembly bracket to the monitor groove.
- c. Insert the bracket towards monitor until it locks in place.



Self-Test

Your monitor provides a self-test feature that allows you to check whether your monitor is functioning properly. If your monitor and computer are properly connected but the monitor screen remains dark, run the monitor self-test by performing the following steps:

- Turn off both your computer and the monitor.
 Unplug the video cable from the back of the computer. To ensure proper Self-Test operation, remove both Digital (white connector) and the Analog (blue connector) cables from the back of computer.
- Turn on the monitor.

The floating dialog box should appear on-screen (against a black background) if the monitor cannot sense a video signal and is working correctly. While in self-test mode, the power LED remains blue. Also, depending upon the selected input, one of the dialogs shown below will continuously scroll through the screen.



- This box also appears during normal system operation, if the video cable becomes disconnected or damaged. The monitor will enter Power Save Mode after 5 minutes if left at this state.
 Turn off your monitor and reconnect the video cable; then turn on both your computer and the monitor.

NOTE: Self-test feature check is not available for S-Video, Composite, and Component video modes.

If your monitor screen remains blank after you use the previous procedure, check your video controller and computer, because your monitor is functioning

Built-in Diagnostics

Your monitor has a built-in diagnostic tool that helps you determine if the screen abnormality you are experiencing is an inherent problem with your monitor, or

NOTE: You can run the built-in diagnostics only when the video cable is unplugged and the monitor is in self-test mode.



To run the built-in diagnostics:

- Ensure that the screen is clean (no dust particles on the surface of the screen).
 Unplug the video cable(s) from the back of the computer or monitor. The monitor then goes into the self-test mode.
 Press and hold the Button 1 and Button 4 on the front panel simultaneously for 2 seconds. A gray screen appears.
 Carefully inspect the screen for abnormalities.
 Press the Button 4 on the front panel again. The color of the screen changes to red.
 Inspect the display for any abnormalities.
 Repeat steps 5 and 6 to inspect the display in green, blue, black, white screens.

The test is complete when the white screen appears. To exit, press the ${\bf Button}~{\bf 4}$ again.

If you do not detect any screen abnormalities upon using the built-in diagnostic tool, the monitor is functioning properly. Check the video card and computer.
