



Power Management Modes

If you have VESA's DPM™ compliance display card or software installed in your PC, the monitor can automatically reduce its power consumption when not in use. 



Plug and Play Capability

You can install the monitor in any Plug and Play-compatible system. The monitor automatically provides its Extended Display Identification Data (EDID) to the computer using Display Data Channel (DDC) protocols so the computer can configure itself and optimize the monitor settings. Most monitor installations are automatic; you can select different settings if desired. For more information about changing the monitor settings, see Operating the Monitor.

LCD Monitor Quality and Pixel Policy

During the LCD Monitor manufacturing process, it is not uncommon for one or more pixels to become fixed in an unchanging state. The visible result is a fixed pixel that appears as an extremely tiny dark or bright discolored dot. When the pixel remains permanently lit, it is known as a "bright dot." When the pixel remains black, it is known as a "dark dot." In almost every case, these fixed pixels are hard to see and do not detract from display quality or usability. A display with 1 to 5 bright/dark dot is considered normal and within competitive standards. For more information, visit Dell Support site at: **support.dell.com.**

Maintenance Guidelines

Cleaning Your Monitor



WARNING: Read and follow the safety instructions before cleaning the monitor.



WARNING: Before cleaning the monitor, unplug the monitor power cable from the electrical outlet.

For best practices, follow the instructions in the list below while unpacking, cleaning, or handling your monitor:

- To clean the monitor screen, lightly dampen a soft, clean cloth with water. If possible, use a special screen-cleaning tissue or solution suitable for the antistatic coating. Do not use benzene, thinner, ammonia, abrasive cleaners, or compressed air.
- Use a lightly-dampened, warm cloth to clean the monitor. Avoid using detergent of any kind as some detergents leave a milky film on the monitor.
- If you notice white powder when you unpack your monitor, wipe it off with a cloth.
- Handle your monitor with care as a darker-colored monitor may scratch and show white scuff marks more than a lighter-colored monitor.
- To help maintain the best image quality on your monitor, use a dynamically changing screen saver and turn off your monitor when not in use.



Attaching the Stand



NOTE: The stand base is detached when the monitor is shipped from the factory.

1. Assemble the stand riser to stand base.



- a. Place the monitor stand base on a stable table top.
- b. Slide the monitor stand body in the correct direction down onto the stand base until it clicks into place.

2 Attach the stand assembly to the monitor.



- a. Place the monitor on a soft cloth or cushion near the edge of a desk.
- b. Align the stand assembly bracket to the monitor groove.
- c. Slide the bracket towards the monitor until it locks in place.

Removing the Monitor Stand for VESA Wall Mount



To remove the stand assembly from the monitor:

- 1. Place the monitor panel on soft cloth or cushion on a stable flat table.
- 2. Use a long screwdriver to push the release latch located in a hole just above the stand.
- 3. Once the latch is released, remove the stand assembly from the monitor.



To connect your monitor to the computer:

1. Turn off your computer and disconnect the power cable.

Connect the blue (VGA) cable from your monitor to your computer.





NOTE: If your computer supports a DVI connector, connect the white DVI cable (optional) from your monitor to your computer.





NOTE: Do not connect both the VGA and the DVI cables to the computer as all monitors ship with the VGA cable attached to the monitor.

2. Connect either the white (digital DVI-D) or the blue (analog VGA) display cable to the corresponding video port of your computer. Do not use both cables on the same computer. Use both the cables only when they are connected to two different computers with appropriate video systems.


- 1. Working from the back of the monitor, attach soundbar by aligning the two slots with the two tabs along the bottom of the monitor.

- 3. Connect the soundbar with the DC power connector from the soundbar Power Adaptor.
- 4. Insert the mini stereo plug from the back of the soundbar into the computer's audio output jack.



Power On the Monitor





Using the Front Panel Controls

Use the control buttons on the front of the monitor to adjust the characteristics of the image being displayed. As you use these buttons to adjust the controls, an OSD shows the numeric values of the characteristics as they change.



The following table describes the front panel buttons:

Auto		Even though your computer recognizes your monitor on startup, the Auto Adjustment function optimizes the display settings for use with your particular setup. Auto Adjustment allows the monitor to self-adjust to the incoming video signal. After using Auto Adjustment, you can further tune your monitor by using the Pixel Clock (Coarse) and Phase (Fine) controls under Display Settings. Auto Adjustment in Progress NOTE: In most cases, Auto Adjust produces the best image for your configuration. NOTE: Auto Adjust option is only available when you are using the analog (VGA) connector.








Preset Modes



- Movie: Loads color settings ideal for movies.

- Text: Loads brightness and sharpness settings ideal for viewing texts.
- Warm: Increase the color temperature. The screen appears warmer with a red/yellow tint.
 Cool: Decreases the color temperature. The screen appears cooler with a blue tint.
- Custom Color: Allows you to manually adjust the color settings. Press the and buttons to adjust the three colors (R, G, B) values and create your own preset color mode.



Setting the Maximum Resolution

To set the maximum resolution for the monitor.

Windows Vista® or Windows® 7:

- 1. Right-click on the desktop and select **Personalization**.
- 2. Click Change Display Settings.
- 3. Move the slider-bar to the right by pressing and holding left-mouse button and adjust the screen resolution to 1440 x 900.
- 4. Click OK.

If you do not see 1440 x 900 as an option, you may need to update your graphics driver. Depending on your computer, complete one of the following procedures.

If you have a Dell desktop or portable computer:

Self-Test


Your monitor provides a self-test feature that allows you to check your monitor's functionality. To run the monitor self-test, perform the following steps:


- 1. Turn off your computer and the monitor.
- 2. Unplug the video cable from the back of the computer. To ensure proper self-test operation, remove the video cable (VGA or DVI-D) from the back of the computer.
- 3. Turn on the monitor.
- 4. A floating dialog box appears on the screen.

NOTE: Depending on the selected input, one of the dialog boxes appears on the screen.

NOTE: The dialog box also appears if the video cable is disconnected or damaged.

NOTE: The power light on the monitor is solid white while in Self-Test. The monitor enters Power Save Mode after 5 minutes if left in the Self-Test mode.





- 5. Turn off your monitor and reconnect the appropriate video cable.
- 6. Turn on your computer and the monitor.

NOTE: If no video appears on your monitor after performing the self-test, there might be a problem with the graphics card. Contact your computer manufacturer for further assistance.

Built-in Diagnostics

Your monitor has a built-in diagnostic tool that helps you to determine if the screen abnormality you are experiencing is an inherent problem with your monitor, or with your computer and graphics card.



To run the built-in diagnostics:

- 1. Ensure that the screen is clean (no dust particles on the surface of the screen).
- 2. Unplug the video cable(s) from the back of the computer or monitor. The monitor then goes into the self-test mode.
- 3. Press and hold the Button 1 and Button 4 on the front panel, simultaneously for 2 seconds. A gray screen appears.
- 4. Carefully inspect the screen for abnormalities.
- 5. Press the Button 4 on the front panel again. The color of the screen changes to red.
- 6. Inspect the display for any abnormalities.
- 7. Repeat steps 5 and 6 to inspect the display in green, blue, black, white, and text screens.

The test is complete when the white screen appears. To exit, press the Button 4 again.

NOTE: If you do not detect any screen abnormalities during the built-in diagnostics, the monitor is functioning properly. There might be a problem with the graphics card. Contact your computer manufacturer for further assistance.

Common Problems

The following table contains general information about common monitor problems you might encounter.
