A minimum of 5 cm space is required between the bottom of the charging mat and any metal surface. Wireless charging will not work if the charging mat is kept on a metal table.

Updating the Firmware of Wireless Charging Mat (via BIOS update).

- 1. Turn on the laptop (Do not connect the power adapter).
- 2. Turn on the Wireless Charging Mat and ensure that charging is working.

NOTE: Do not remove the laptop from the wireless charging mat during the BIOS update process.

- 3. Connect and turn on the power adapter to the laptop.
- 4. Go to dell.com/support.
- 5. Click Product Support, enter the Service Tag of your laptop, and click Submit.

NOTE: If you do not have the Service Tag, use the auto-detect feature or manually browse for your laptop model.

- 6. Click Drivers and downloads.
- 7. Scroll down the page and select BIOS from the Category drop-down list.

NOTE: In the Change OS drop-down list, select the operating system installed on your computer. 8. Expand BIOS to view the available BIOS files.

- 9. Click Download File to download the latest version of the BIOS for your laptop.
- 10. Save the file and once the download is complete, navigate to the folder where you saved the BIOS update file.
