The GUI enables remote systems management in a one-to-one method.

Important Notes

- The drivers exposed by Lifecycle Controller are present in a read-only drive, labeled OEMDRV, which are active for 18 hours. During this period:
 - o You cannot update any DUP.
 - o Lifecycle Controller cannot invoke CSIOR.

However, if an AC power cycle (cold boot) is performed, the OEMDRV drive is automatically deleted.

- To log the update events in the Lifecycle Log, make sure that the installed versions of Lifecycle Controller and iDRAC are from the same release.
- If Lifecycle Controller and iDRAC are not from the same release, the Lifecycle Log displays blank messages and messages with a "~" character.

Known Issues

Issue 1

Description

If FlexAddress is enabled on Chassis Management Controllers, iDRAC and Lifecycle Controller do not display the same MAC addresses.

Resolution

To view the chassis-assigned MAC address, use the iDRAC Web interface or the CMC Web interface. Go to **General** > **Network Settings**.

Issue 2

Description

Deployment of Windows operating system may intermittently stop with the following error message:

A required CD/DVD drive device driver is missing. If you have a driver floppy disk, CD, DVD, or USB flash drive, please insert it now.

Resolution (only for logging on to iDRAC7 Web interface)

Reboot to Lifecycle Controller and retry until the operating system is successfully deployed.

Issue 3

Description

While deploying Windows Server 2008 R2 SP1 from **OS Deployment** of Lifecycle Controller, installation stops with the following error:

There is no disk in the drive. Please insert a disk into drive \Device\Harddisk0\DRO.

This issue may occur due to any of the following reasons:

- Virtual Media is in the attached state, with no media mapped.
- Virtual Media is in the auto-attached state, with media mapped.
- Virtual Media being presented by the AVCT SIP and Virtual Media from iDRAC7 in the detached state.
- The underlying cause may be due to failure to load drivers for RAID controllers on the system.

Note: It does not occur with Virtual Media in the detached state. It also does not occur without the SIP and with Virtual Media in the detached from iDRAC7.

Resolution

Retry the operation.

Issue 4

Description

Some of the supported components are not displayed on the Firmware Update-> View Current Versions page.

Resolution

Reboot the system and open View Current Versions page.

Issue 5

Description

For an Intel(R) Ethernet X520 10GbE Dual Port KX4-KR Mezzanine card, after the firmware is downgraded from version 14.0.12 to version 13.5.6, the View Current Versions page displays the firmware version for the card as 5.6 instead of 13.5.6.

Resolution

Update the firmware by running the Update Package through the operating system.

Limitations

Limitation 1

Description

The following characters are supported for 'User Name' and 'Password':

- Digits (0–9)
- Alphanumeric (a–z, A–Z)
- Hyphen (-)

Note: For 'Domain Name', a period (.) is allowed. For example, 'x123.com'.

Limitation 2

Description

While updating an iDRAC firmware by using a tool other than Lifecycle Controller, Lifecycle Controller must not be open, or running; because, it results in an unknown behavior. Use Lifecycle Controller after the firmware is successfully updated.

Limitation 3

Description

If the iDRAC firmware update is interrupted for any reason, wait for 30 minutes before attempting another firmware update.

Description

Only Windows operating systems can be deployed on systems with a software RAID controller.

Description

Description

After the CPLD firmware is updated on modular servers, the View Current Versions page in Firmware Update displays the firmware update date as Jan 1, 2000 regardless of the actual update date.

Rollback is not supported for CPLD.

On some modular systems, after a Firmware Update, the Lifecycle Log displays the date in the time stamp as 1999-12-31, instead of the date on which Firmware Update was performed.

Description

Windows Server 2012 does not support \$110 software RAID controller.

The Emulex fiber channel card firmware cannot be rolled back from version 01.03.01 to version 01.01.06.

Lifecycle Controller cannot update Emulex FC card from version 1.01.06 to version 1.03.01.

Resolution

While updating from version 1.01.06 to version 1.03.01, run the Emulex firmware Update Package twice, and then reboot after each update.

Description
