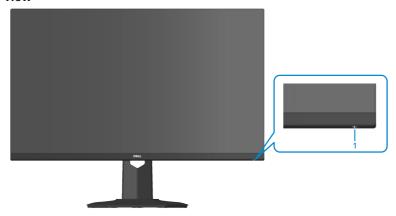

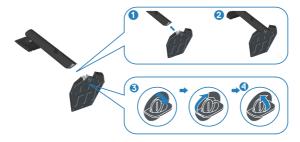

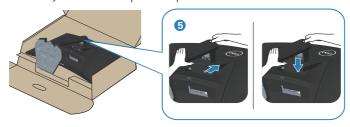
Setting up the monitor

Connecting the stand

- NOTE: The stand is detached when the monitor is shipped from the factory.
- NOTE: The following procedure is applicable to the stand that is shipped with your monitor. If you are connecting a third-party stand, see the documentation that is shipped with the stand.
 - 1. Follow the instructions on the flaps of packaging box to remove the stand from the top cushion that secures it.
 - 2. Connect the stand base to the stand riser.
 - 3. Open the screw handle on the stand base and tighten the screw to secure the stand riser to the stand base.
 - 4. Close the screw handle.



5. Slide the tabs on the stand assembly into the slots on the monitor and press the stand assembly down to snap it into place.





6. Place the monitor in an upright position.





Connecting your monitor

MARNING: Before you begin any of the procedures in this section, follow the Safety instructions.

NOTE: Do not connect all cables to the monitor at the same time. It is recommend to route the cables through the cable-management slot before you connect them to the monitor.

To connect your monitor to the computer:

- 1. Turn off your computer and disconnect the power cable.
- 2. Connect the HDMI (purchased separately) or DisplayPort cable (shipped with your monitor) from your monitor to the computer.

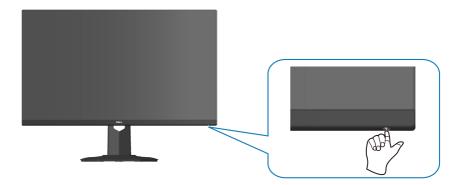

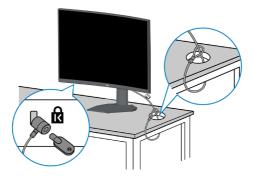
Securing your monitor using Kensington lock (optional)

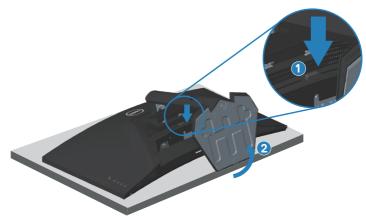


Removing the stand

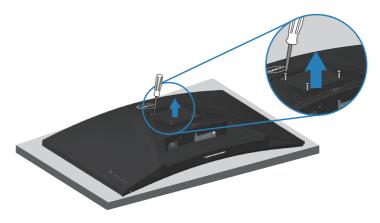

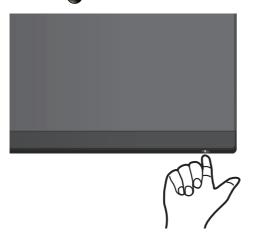

- 3. Press the joystick button again to confirm the settings and exit.



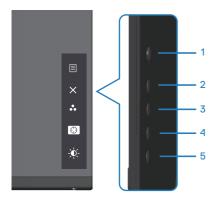

Preset Modes

In Preset Modes, you can choose Standard, FPS, MOBA/RTS, RPG, SPORTS, Game 1/Game 2/Game 3, ComfortView, Warm, Cool, or Custom Color from the list.

- **Standard**: Loads the monitor's default color settings. This is the default preset mode.
- FPS: Loads color settings ideal for First-Person Shooter games.
- MOBA/RTS: Loads color settings ideal for Multiplayer Online Battle Arena (MOBA) and Real-Time Strategy (RTS) games.
- RPG: Loads color settings ideal for Role-Playing games.
- **SPORTS:** Loads color settings ideal for "SPORTS" games.
- Game 1/Game 2/Game 3: Allows you to customize the color settings for your gaming needs.
- ComfortView: Decreases the level of blue light emitted from the screen to make viewing more comfortable for your eyes.

WARNING: The possible long-term effects of blue light emission from the monitor may cause personal injury such as digital eye strain, eye fatigue and damage to the eyes. Using monitor for extended periods of time may also cause pain in parts of body such as neck, arm, back and shoulder. For more information, see Ergonomics.

- Warm: Increases the color temperature. The screen appears warmer with a red/yellow tint.
- Cool: Decreases the color temperature. The screen appears cooler with a blue tint.
- Custom Color: Allows you to manually adjust the color settings. Move the joystick to adjust the Gain, Offset, Hue, and Saturation values and create your own preset color mode.

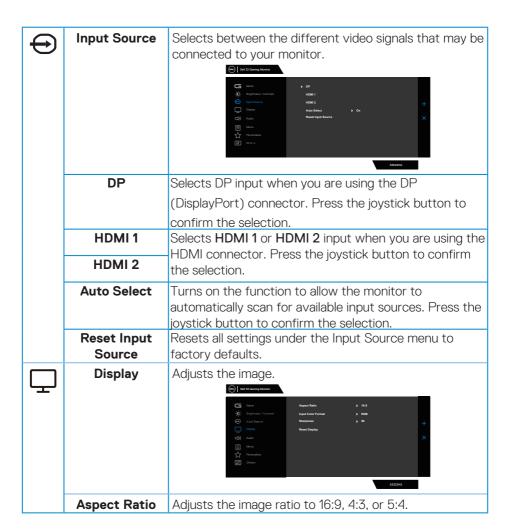

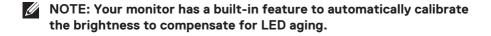

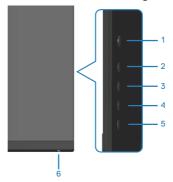




Menu and Power button lock

Prevents users to access or change OSD menu settings on the display.

By default, the Menu and Power button lock setting is disabled.



To access the Lock menu, press and hold button 5 for four seconds. A Lock menu appears at the bottom right corner of the display.

NOTE: The Lock menu can be accessed using this method when the Menu and Power buttons are in Unlock state.



To access the Unlock menu, press and hold button 5 for four seconds. An Unlock menu appears at the bottom right corner of the display.

NOTE: The Unlock menu can be accessed when the Menu and Power buttons are in Lock state.





There are three lock options.

1	Menu Buttons	When Menu Buttons is selected, the OSD menu settings cannot be changed. All buttons are locked except Power button.
2	Power Button	When Power Button is selected, the display cannot be turned off using the Power button.

In the following scenarios, the icon appears at the center of the display:

- When the joystick and control buttons (buttons 1 5) are pressed. This indicates the OSD menu buttons are in Lock state.
- When the Power button (button 6) is pressed. This indicates the Power button is in Lock state.
- When any one of the six buttons are pressed. This indicates OSD menu buttons and the Power button is in Lock state.

Unlocking the OSD menu and Power buttons:

- 1. Press and hold button 5 for four seconds. The Unlock menu appears.
- 2. Select the Unlock icon to unlock the buttons on the display.



OSD warning messages

When the monitor does not support a particular resolution mode, the following message is displayed:



This means that the monitor cannot synchronize with the signal that it is receiving from the computer. 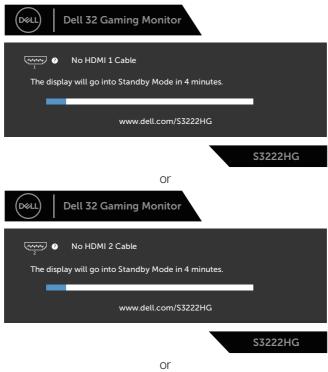

Setting the maximum resolution

To set the maximum resolution for the monitor:

- 2. Right-click on the desktop and click **Screen Resolution**.
- 3. Click the dropdown list of the Screen Resolution and select 1920 x 1080.
- 4. Click OK.

In Windows® 10:

- 1. Right-click on the desktop and click **Display settings**.
- 2. Click Advanced display settings.
- Click the dropdown list of the Choose display and select the correct display model number.
- 4. Click Display adapter properties.
- 5. Click **List All Modes** on the new pop-up window and select **1920 x 1080**.
- 6. Click OK and OK.

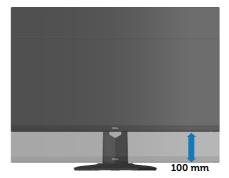

Ergonomics

CAUTION: Improper or prolonged usage of keyboard may result in injury.

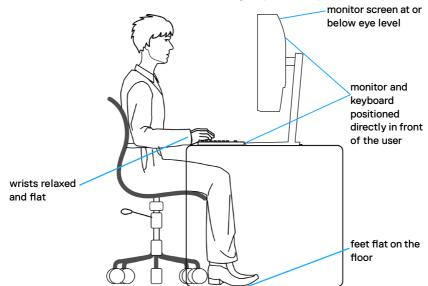

For comfort and efficiency, observe the following guidelines when setting up and using your computer workstation:

- · Position your computer so that the monitor and keyboard are directly in front of you as you work. Special shelves are commercially available to help you correctly position your keyboard.
- To reduce the risk of eye strain and neck/arm/back/shoulder pain from using the monitor for long periods of time, we suggest you to:
 - 1. Set the distance of the screen from 20 to 28 in. (50 to 70 cm) from your eyes.
 - 2. Blink frequently to moisten your eyes or wet your eyes with water after prolonged usage of the monitor.
 - 3. Take regular and frequent breaks for 20 minutes every two hours.
 - 4. Look away from your monitor and gaze at a distant object at 20 feet away for at least 20 seconds during the breaks.
 - 5. Perform stretches to relieve tension in the neck, arm, back, and shoulders during the breaks.
- · Make sure that the monitor screen is at eye level or slightly lower when you are sitting in front of the monitor.
- · Adjust the tilt of the monitor, its contrast, and brightness settings.
- · Adjust the ambient lighting around you (such as overhead lights, desk lamps, and the curtains or blinds on nearby windows) to minimize reflections and glare on the monitor screen.
- Use a chair that provides good lower-back support.
- · Keep your forearms horizontal with your wrists in a neutral, comfortable position while using the keyboard or mouse.
- · Always leave space to rest your hands while using the keyboard or mouse.
- · Let your upper arms rest naturally on both sides.
- · Ensure that your feet are resting flat on the floor.



- When sitting, make sure that the weight of your legs is on your feet and not on the front portion of your seat. Adjust your chair's height or use a footrest if necessary to maintain a proper posture.
- Vary your work activities. Try to organize your work so that you do not have to sit and work for extended periods of time. Try to stand or get up and walk around at regular intervals.
- Keep the area under your desk clear of obstructions and cables or power cords that may interfere with comfortable seating or present a potential trip hazard.

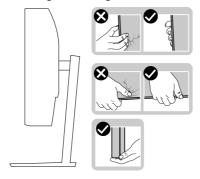




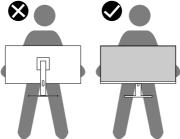
Handling and moving your display

To ensure the monitor is handled safely when lifting or moving it, follow the guidelines mentioned below:

- Before moving or lifting the monitor, turn off your computer and the monitor.
- · Disconnect all cables from the monitor.
- · Place the monitor in the original box with the original packing materials.
- Hold the bottom edge and the side of the monitor firmly without applying excessive pressure when lifting or moving the monitor.

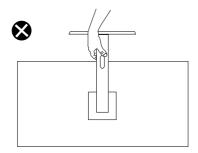


• When lifting or moving the monitor, ensure the screen is facing away from you and do not press on the display area to avoid any scratches or damage.



- · When transporting the monitor, avoid any sudden shock or vibration to it.
- When lifting or moving the monitor, do not turn the monitor upside down while holding the stand base or stand riser. This may result in accidental damage to the monitor or cause personal injury.





Maintenance guidelines

Cleaning your monitor

MARNING: Before cleaning the monitor, unplug the monitor power cable from the electrical outlet.

CAUTION: Read and follow the Safety instructions before cleaning the monitor.

For best practices, follow the instructions in the list below while unpacking, cleaning or handling your monitor:

- To clean your screen, lightly dampen a soft, clean cloth with water. If
 possible, use a special screen-cleaning tissue or solution suitable for the antistatic coating. Do not use benzene, thinner, ammonia, abrasive cleaners or
 compressed air.
- Use a lightly-dampened cloth to clean the monitor. Avoid using detergent of any kind as some detergents leave a milky film on the monitor.
- If you notice white powder when you unpack your monitor, wipe it off with a cloth.
- Handle your monitor with care as the black-colored monitor may get scratched and show white scuff marks.
- To help maintain the best image quality on your monitor, use a dynamically changing screen saver and turn off your monitor when not in use.



Troubleshooting

MARNING: Before you begin any of the procedures in this section, follow the Safety instructions.

Self-Test

Your monitor provides a self-test feature that allows you to check if your monitor is functioning properly. If your monitor and computer are properly connected but the monitor screen remains dark, run the monitor self-test by performing the following steps:

- Turn off both your computer and the monitor.
- 2. Disconnect all video cables from the monitor. This way, the computer doesn't have to be involved.
- 3. Turn on the monitor.

If the monitor is working correctly, it detects that there is no signal and one of the following message appears. While in self-test mode, the power LED remains white.







NOTE: This box also appears during normal system operation, if the

4. Turn off your monitor and reconnect the video cable; then turn on your computer and the monitor.

video cable is disconnected or damaged.

If your monitor remains dark after you reconnect the cables, check your video controller and computer.

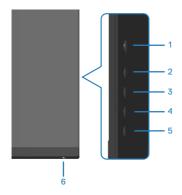


Built-in diagnostics

Your monitor has a built-in diagnostic tool that helps you determine if any screen abnormality you experience is an inherent problem with your monitor, or with your computer and video card.



NOTE: You can run the built-in diagnostics only when the video cable is unplugged and the monitor is in self-test mode.



To run the built-in diagnostics:

- 1. Ensure that the screen is clean (no dust particles on the surface of the screen).
- 2. Unplug the video cable(s) from the back of the computer or monitor. The monitor then goes into the self-test mode.
- 3. Press and hold button 5 for four seconds to enter the OSD Lock/Unlock menu.







- 4. Move the joystick to highlight the Diagnostic icon icon to run the built-in diagnostics.
- 5. Carefully inspect the screen for abnormalities.
- 6. Press the joystick to change the test patterns.
- 7. Repeat steps 5 and 6 to inspect the display in red, green, blue, black, white and text pattern screens.

The test is complete when the text pattern screen appears. To exit, press the joystick right direction again.

If you do not detect any screen abnormalties upon using the built-in diagnostic tool, the monitor is functioning properly. Check the video card and computer.



Common problems

Video Ghosting or Overshooting	 Change the Response Time in the Display OSD to Fast, Super Fast, or MPRT depending on your application and usage.
