- A null-modem DB9 serial cable (included with the array)
- A switch serial console management cable (included with the switch)

### 2.2.1 VMware host operating system

- Latest EqualLogic Multipathing Extension Module for VMware® vSphere installation package (https://eglsupport.dell.com/).
- Latest SAN HeadQuarters installation package (<a href="https://eqlsupport.dell.com/">https://eqlsupport.dell.com/</a>).
- The VMware vSphere® Command-Line Interface (vCLI) environment must be installed on the management server (vmware.com/downloads).
- Latest network device driver update (vmware.com/downloads).

Before proceeding, you may need to download a driver update package for your network adapter. Refer to the readme.txt contained in the update file for instructions on updating from the ESXi command line or using VMware Update Manager (VUM).

### 2.3 Configuration settings

#### 2.3.1 VMware host operating system

This document assumes that you have already installed VMware ESXi and have applied the latest critical patches available through VMware Update Manager.

To properly configure your vSphere ESXi system, you must also have a management system available. This system must be running Windows (2008, Windows 7, etc.)

### 2.3.2 Windows host operating system

This document assumes that you have already installed Windows 2008 R2 with Service Pack 1 or later and have applied the latest critical security updates available through Windows Update.

### 2.3.3 Red Hat Enterprise Linux operating system

This document assumes that you have already installed RHEL 6.5 or later and have applied the latest critical security updates available through Linux.

### 2.3.4 FS7610 NAS with Fluid File System

If you have a FS7610 appliance, you must be running FluidFS version 3 or later. This document assumes that all BIOS and firmware are up to data as required and that the FS7610 appliance is not configured (or has been re-initialized if previously configured).







Figure 2 Dell Networking N4000 or PowerConnect 8100 series with EqualLogic PS7610 and PS4110 or PS6110 (tables on page 13)








Figure 5 Dell NetworkingN4000 or PowerConnect 8100 series and EqualLogic PS6510 (tables on page 15)
